Goals and Intended Outcomes

Goals & Intended Outcomes

The school focused on providing students with an enriched environment characterized by respectful relationships and a sense of belonging. Student wellbeing is enhanced through a range of programs and opportunities offered at MILC.

The school's intended outcomes are as follows:

- Continue to provide students with the best wellbeing support
- Develop further support to parents, guardians and students through the connection with both our pastoral and academic team
- Strengthen and implement respectful behaviours and relationships for the school
- To continue to promote understanding of diversity and inclusion for all students.

Achievements

The school has a strong focus on building positive relationships between students and between students and staff.

The Pastoral Care team has provided positive and engaging relationships between internal and external support services for both our students and their parents.

The school has developed a consistent approach to positive behaviour management with a clear focus on building a positive school and classroom environment.

Student Attendance

Attendance of student is electronically recorded daily in our system and there is an expectation that teachers keep a record of attendance in each of their classes. When a student is absent, we promptly contact parents or guardians, or a member of our pastoral care team for our boarders. If the absence is ongoing, the attendance is monitored by the staff office. We record all evidence of absences, and any concerns are shortly followed up with students' parents or guardians. Strategies are applied to support students to maximise attendance to improve student's study progress.



Goals & Intended Outcomes

Melbourne Intercultural Learning Centre has been responsible for the oversight and compliance of the implementation of the Victorian Child Safe Standards and Ministerial Order 1359. In accordance with the Victorian Child Safe Standard the school has established the Child Protection Program which sets out our work systems, practices, policies and procedures designed to not only ensure compliance, but also to develop a child safe culture.

Achievements

- The development and implementation of a range of policies and procedures, including
 a Child Safety Code of Conduct outlining appropriate standards of behaviour to
 children.
- All staff, including management, and other Mandatory Reporters are responsible for supporting the safety of children by reading and accepting the Child Safety Code of Conduct and all other relevant policies.
- The effective implementation of the school 's Child Protection Program
- Identifying and removing children protection risks by adopting a risk management approach
- Professional development and induction for staff, management, third party contractors, volunteers and visitors relating to expectations for them to comply with MILC policies and procedures.
- Providing Child Protection Training to staff, managers, and other Mandatory Reporters
- Identifying ways that students can identify concerns and a clear procedure for staff to report child abuse
- Offering all students enrolling at MILC a comprehensive orientation program which includes respectful relationships and a student conduct policy




Achievements
